Objectives/Outcomes of PPG spending 2017/18
<p>Objectives in spending PPG:</p> <p>At St. Mary of the Angels, we are dedicated to providing quality teaching and learning opportunities to meet the needs of all pupils, particularly vulnerable and disadvantaged pupils.</p> <p>The Pupil Premium funding we receive is used to ensure that all disadvantaged children are supported in making progress towards meeting or exceeding age related expectations. This progress is continually monitored and reviewed and funding and resources targeted effectively to help accelerate progress and close gaps in learning. This includes a long standing commitment to support disadvantaged pupils in the Foundation Stage, to ensure the majority of pupils meet age related expectations by the end of Reception and are ready for Year 1.</p> <p>Our main aims are to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Close any gaps in attainment for disadvantaged pupils, compared to their non-disadvantaged peers, in all subjects 2. Maintain high expectations and standards for pupils eligible for Pupil Premium 3. Ensure all pupils are given the same opportunities to develop their potential and participate fully in extra-curricular activities in and outside of school
<p>How the money was spent;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Provide one to one tuition for Year 5 and 6 pupils eligible for pupil premium who were at risk of not meeting the expected standard in Maths at the end of KS2 ➤ Fund experienced class teacher to support disadvantaged pupils at risk of not meeting age related expectations across KS1 & KS2 ➤ Provide interventions to improve memory and motor skills to develop writing fluency for targeted pupils ➤ Psychotherapy support for individual vulnerable pupils (provided the Anna Freud and The Catholic Children's Society) ➤ Financial support for disadvantaged children to access out of school activities such as residential trips in Year 5 and 6 and after school clubs/providing a wider range of high quality enrichment opportunities during school hours to engage pupils and enhance the creative curriculum with a particular focus on poetry, music, art, dance and drama ➤ After school booster sessions for targeted pupil premium children (Year 6 teachers) ➤ Employing an additional 0.5 teacher support to maintain the low pupil teacher ratio in Reception (taught in two classes with a maximum teacher pupil ratio of 1:22/1:23) <p>Total spend: £103,531</p>

Our pupils eligible for the PP continue to achieve well at the end of KS2 when compared to their PP peers and all pupils nationally. In 2018 our PP pupils' attainment was

- **above** their non PP peers nationally in all three subjects, significantly so in reading (+19%) and maths (+19%).
- **above** all pupils nationally in reading (+8%) and maths (+6%) and in line in writing
- the same as their non PP peers in school in reading but below in writing (-8%) and maths(-11%).

In 2018 our pupils eligible for the PP achievement was above all pupils nationally (+6%) and significantly above their PP peers nationally (+16%) and in line with their non PP peers nationally (-3%). attainment of all pupil nationally.

Plans for Pupil Premium expenditure 2018/2019: Approved by the Achievement, Standards and Behaviour Committee on 1/11/18

- Provide one to one tuition for Year 5 and 6 pupils eligible for pupil premium who were at risk of not meeting the expected standard in Maths at the end of KS2 **£5,000**
- Maintain current level of teaching assistant support to provide interventions to accelerate progress/close the gap in English and Maths
- Psychotherapy support for individual vulnerable pupils (provided the Anna Freud and The Catholic Children's Society) **£20,000**
- Financial support for disadvantaged children to access out of school activities including residential trips in Year 5 and 6 and after school clubs
