Objectives/Outcomes of PPG spending 2018/19

Objectives in spending PPG:

At St. Mary of the Angels, we are dedicated to providing quality teaching and learning opportunities to meet the needs of all pupils, particularly vulnerable and disadvantaged pupils.

The Pupil Premium funding we receive is used to ensure that all disadvantaged children are supported in making progress towards meeting or exceeding age related expectations. This progress is continually monitored and reviewed and funding and resources targeted effectively to help accelerate progress and close gaps in learning. This includes a long standing commitment to support disadvantaged pupils in the Foundation Stage, to ensure the majority of pupils meet age related expectations by the end of Reception and are ready for Year 1.

Our main aims are to:

1. Close any gaps in attainment for disadvantaged pupils, compared to their non-disadvantaged peers, in all subjects
2. Maintain high expectations and standards for pupils eligible for Pupil Premium
3. Ensure all pupils are given the same opportunities to develop their potential and participate fully in extra- curricular activities in and outside of school

How the money was spent in 2018/19

- Providing one to one tuition for Year 5 and 6 pupils eligible for pupil premium who were at risk of not meeting the expected standard in Maths at the end of KS2
- Maintain current level of teaching assistant support to provide interventions to accelerate progress/close the gap in English and Maths
- Psychotherapy support for individual vulnerable pupils (provided the Anna Freud and The Catholic Children's Society)
- Financial support for disadvantaged children to access out of school activities including residential trips in Year 5 and 6 and after school clubs
- Provide a wide range of high quality enrichment opportunities during school hours to engage pupils and enhance the creative curriculum
- After school booster sessions for targeted pupil premium children (Year 6 teachers)
- Online platforms to develop maths and reading skills (Mathletics and Bug Club Reading)
- Annual Life Bus visit – focus on keeping healthy (all year groups)
- One to one reading support provided by Beanstalk Reading Volunteers

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OUTCOMES FOR PUPILS ELIGIBLE FOR THE PUPIL PREMIUM 2018-19

End of Key Stage 2:

2018/19 Year 6 Cohort: 35 pupils. 10 pupils (29%) eligible for PP.

Our pupils eligible for the PP continue to achieve well at the end of KS2 when compared to their PP peers and all pupils nationally. In 2019 our PP pupils' attainment was

- In line or above their non PP peers nationally (significantly above in maths + 13%)
- In line with all pupils nationally in maths
- Below all pupils nationally in reading (-13%) and writing (-9%)
- Below their non PP pupils in school significantly so in reading (-12%) and writing (-18%)

In 2019 the achievement of pupils eligible for the PP in RWM was above their PP peers nationally (+9%) and just below that of all pupils nationally (-5%).

Plans for Pupil Premium expenditure 2019/2020: Approved by the Achievement, Standards and Behaviour Committee on 28/11/19

- Provide one to one tuition for Year 5 and 6 pupils eligible for pupil premium who were at risk of not meeting the expected standard in Maths at the end of KS2
- Provide small group tuition for Year 6 pupils eligible for pupil premium who were at risk of not meeting the expected standard in Reading at the end of KS2
- Maintain current level of teaching assistant support to provide interventions to accelerate progress/close the gap in English and Maths
- Psychotherapy support for individual vulnerable pupils (provided the Anna Freud and The Catholic Children's Society)
- Athletics
- Bug Club Reading
- Financial support for disadvantaged children to access out of school activities including residential trips in Year 5 and 6 and after school clubs
- Provide a wide range of high quality enrichment opportunities during school hours to engage pupils and enhance the creative curriculum
- Reduce the ratio of staff pupils in Reception by having 2 Reception classes (ratio of 1: 10)
