
Dress to Express

Paying for books



1066 History Project

History has been in the spotlight this week as our Key Stage 2 classes took part in an exciting history project led by Westminster Archives Education Officer Peter Daniel and two actors from the MoD Theatre Company. The children learnt all about the history of the events leading up to the Battle of Hastings in 1066 through role play, drama and song, ending their respective day's immersive experience by re-enacting the Battle of Hastings! The 1066 project also focused on the history of Westminster comparing and contrasting life in Westminster in 1066 to present day. The project also aims to address some of the mental health issues caused by

lockdown by encouraging the children to reflect on how a positive mind-set helped Duke William become a conqueror and understand the team work required to build a defensive wall made of Saxon shields. More news to follow on our Key Stage 2 class pages!

A special thank you to Westminster City Council for the donation of plants and shrubs from the decommissioned Marble Hill Mound. With the help of a local gardener we have been able to transform three very sad and neglected beds in and around the school with 150 plants of 25 types including Choisya, Geranium, Peonies, Acers, Rosemary and French Lavenders.
