## Anti-Bullying Week: 13<sup>th</sup> - 17<sup>th</sup> November

Anti-bullying Week is an annual national event supported by the Anti-Bullying Alliance that aims to shine a spotlight on bullying and encourage children, teachers and parents to take action against bullying throughout the year. The theme this year is 'Make A Noise About Bullying' and the week will begin with Odd Socks Day on Monday 13th November when children and staff are encouraged to wear odd socks to school to celebrate what makes us all unique. Throughout the week there will be special anti-bullying activities and workshops in all classes. Our school's 'STOP' acronym continues to support pupils, staff and parents/carers in identifying and preventing/stopping bullying.
