# 'Look North More Often' Poetry Workshop: Swans Class

What a week it has been at St Mary of the Angels! Earlier this term, The Poetry Society facilitated a day of free writing and performance workshops to our Year 6 pupils in the Swans class. Students worked with acclaimed poet Coral Rumble. During the workshop, the children learned about the history of the Christmas tree in Trafalgar Square, which the people of Norway have given to the people of London every year since 1947 in gratitude for Britain's support for Norway during World War II.

Last night, three children chosen by Coral read a poem at the lighting of the Christmas tree in Trafalgar Square. Beatriz, Tilly-Jo and Alexander performed beautifully in front of hundreds of people, as well as the Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan, and the Lord Mayor of Westminster, Councillor Patricia McAllister.



We are extremely proud of the children for representing our school in such a marvellous way. You'll be able to listen to their rendition of the poem in a podcast from The Poetry Society soon. The tree will be up in Trafalgar Square until 6 January 2024 and the poem will be available to read around its base.
