

## CURRICULUM – LEARNING MEANS THE WORLD

Our curriculum 'Learning Means the World' allows pupils to build knowledge, skills, attitudes and values, through well-planned and resourced cross-curricular theme units which fully cover the National Curriculum. The themes put important world issues like **conservation, conflict, culture and communication** at the heart of learning and pupils follow four learning pathways: In Upper Key Stage 2 we follow the **NAVIGATORS** pathway (Year 5 and 6, 9 – 11 years)

## ENGLISH

### Diary Entries/Opinion Piece

This term, your child will be learning about the features and structures of a diary entry and opinion piece, using texts based on Anne Frank. They will be learning how to use informal language, modal verbs and relative clauses.

## MATHS

Your child will be developing their understanding of:

- Fractions: Adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing fractions
- Fractions: Fractions of an amount
- Measurement: converting units of measure

## SCIENCE

This term, our topic is 'Growing Up and Growing Old'. The national curriculum link is 'Animals, including humans' and we will be focusing on Biology. In this topic children look at and describe the changes as humans develop to old age. Pupils draw a timeline to indicate stages in the growth and development of humans and learn about the changes experienced in puberty.

## HISTORY/GEOGRAPHY

'Wars of the World' is a thematic unit, based on conflicts past and present, with a key focus on history and geography. Pupils will learn about the root causes of war and have an understanding of its impact, focusing on the two World Wars in particular. They will also learn about civil wars and pacifism.

## RELATIONSHIP AND HEALTH EDUCATION

Our module is 'Created and Loved by God'. Your child will explore the individual. Rooted in the teaching that we are made in the image and likeness of God, it helps children to develop an understanding of the importance of valuing themselves as the basis for personal relationships. They will learn about the topics of identity, girls' bodies, boys' bodies and personal hygiene.

## P.E

Your child will take part in P.E lessons at school on **Wednesdays and Thursdays**. They will be learning the skills involved with football and cricket.
