#### Relationship and Health Education: Life to the Full

#### **'Look North More Often' Poetry Workshop: Swans Class**

Earlier this term, The Poetry Society facilitated a day of free writing and performance workshops to our Year 6 pupils in the Swans class. Students worked with acclaimed poet Coral Rumble. During the workshop, the children learned about the history of the Christmas tree in Trafalgar Square, which the people of Norway have given to the people of London every year since 1947 in gratitude for Britain's support for Norway during World War II. Three children were selected by Coral read a poem at the lighting of the Christmas tree in Trafalgar Square and performed the poem beautifully in front of hundreds of people, as well as the Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan, and the Lord Mayor of Westminster, Councillor Patricia McAllister. The Poetry Society have now published on their website a video of the children who read the poem in Trafalgar Square before Christmas. They have also uploaded a podcast, which the children were interviewed for on

## **Guidance for Parent Volunteers on School Trips**



- ✓ Attend our pre-visit meeting. It will occur immediately before the trip. You will be welcomed and briefed on the rules, routines and expectations for the day.
- ✓ Follow the teacher's instructions, and make sure that your group are also listening and following instructions.
- ✓ Remember that you are responsible for your group of children at all times. We will give you a register with the names of all your pupils on it. Please conduct regular headcounts and make sure you can see them at all times.
- ✓ Alert the teacher immediately if there's an emergency. The teacher is responsible for contacting the school and the associated parents.
- ✓ Turn your phone off. We ask that you don't use your phone during the trip, so that you can stay focused on looking out for your group of pupils.
- ✓ Make sure your pupils are strapped in, if the trip involves coach travel.
- Enjoy the trip!

# **DON'T**

- X Show preferential treatment to your child, their friends, or your group.
- Try and administer first aid or medication yourself. Leave that to the teacher. We will tell you which teacher is responsible for first aid, and if you're not sure, ask.
- X Offer food to any pupils. Remember, they might have an allergy.
- Share any information you learn about pupils with anyone else. You are an acting member of the school staff and are bound by the same rules we follow. We maintain confidentiality at all times, especially when dealing with information about pupils' medical needs.
- **X** Take photos of the pupils. This is for child protection reasons.
- Leave your group without telling anyone. You shouldn't leave your group at any time, but, if you have to, because of an emergency, please let a teacher know.
- X Take a child to the toilet. For pupils in Years 3 to 6 who can use the toilet independently you can wait outside while they go in as a group or a pair. For pupils in Nursery to Year 2 or older pupils who need assistance using the toilet you must inform the teacher who will take or arrange for a member of staff to take the pupil to the toilet.
- Never go into the toilet yourself while the children are in the toilets unless a member of staff is present.
